Check the word count on your abstract! JSHS allows a maximum of 250 words. Please follow all directions for registering projects and/or research papers. Before registering make sure you have this information:

1. Contact info for students and chaperones
2. Title and advisor information for papers and projects
3. Text of paper/project abstract ready to paste into the database.

Registration for JSHS - All students will need to register in TWO platforms

1. **Cvent** - register through Cvent [HERE](#). Students will need to upload a filled out 'Statement Of Outside Assistance' form you can find [HERE](#) this form will also be available during your registration.
2. **ZFairs** - register through Zfairs [HERE](#). This is where students will upload your presentation video. **This is a separate account from their Science Fair zFairs account.**

PLEASE DECIDE BY Wednesday, March 3 if you will compete in JSHS. If you choose NOT to attend the virtual JSHS symposium, please email director@tcrsf.net with your name, grade and phone number for confirmation. Or you may call 763-577-1400 and leave a message with your name (please spell last name), and that you will not be attending JSHS/the paper competition. **Please decide soon (by Wednesday, March 3)** so that we may be able to advance an alternate to take your spot.

Some of you have asked if you may change your abstract, paper, or add to your work or replicate results between Twin Cities and tri-state JSHS. – Yes! Be sure you continue to follow all rules. JSHS allows you to present multiple years' work – but only your own work!

2021 JSHS is virtual so will be required to enter a narrated PowerPoint as your presentation. Details are on the MNMAS.org site under Junior Science & Humanities Symposium.
